Macquarie University’s Centre for Dispute Assessment and Resolution (CeDAR) recently conducted the first ever mediation course in Fiji. Fiji already has voluntary and compulsory conciliation and arbitration as part of its *Trade Disputes Act* Cap 97 but a new Act of Parliament currently before the Fiji Parliament will seek to set up a compulsory system of mediation prior to any trade dispute being adjudicated.
