REVISION OF THE FOOD STANDARDS CODE

The revised Code was gazetted on 10 April 2015 and came into effect on 1 March 2016.

An audit of the legal efficacy of the *Australia New Zealand Food Standards Code* was conducted following a decision of the New South Wales Supreme Court in 2009. FSANZ prepared Proposal P1025 to revise the Code to address the issues identified in the audit in consultation with regulators.

FSANZ reviewed the Food Standards Code to make the requirements clearer and to ensure it better meets the needs of stakeholders. The changes will reduce uncertainty when it comes to code enforcement issues.

Primarily, changes have been made to Chapters 1 and 2 and include updating

the wording to clarify key areas, such as:

Food Legislation NSW

- the Code's requirements; to make it clearer who has to comply;
- provisions relating to food additives, processing aids and nutritive substances; and
- food composition requirements; to clarify when a

requirement is:

- o legally required for the sale of a product; or
- a prerequisite to a permission, for example to add a food additive.

Chapters 3 and 4 have not been revised and have been incorporated in their current forms.

New Standard 5.1.1 – Revocation and transitional provisions – 2014 Revision has been included as it revokes Chs 1 and 2 of the previous version of the Code.

The 29 Schedules have also been included.

AMENDED LEGISLATION

Purpose of amendments

- To amend the definition of 'Chief Executive Officer' and omit the definition of 'member of staff of the Food Authority'.
- To insert a provision relating to persons who may be employed in the Public Service as staff of the NSW Food Authority.
- To omit 'Director-General of the Department of Environment and Climate Change' and replace with 'Chief Executive of the Office of Environment and Heritage'.
- To omit 'Director-General of the Department of Health' and replace with 'Secretary of the Ministry of Health'.

Amended provisions

- Sections 4, 108, 110, 136A amended.
- Section 109A reinserted.

- To insert new provision regarding the Australia and New Zealand Ministerial Forum on Food Regulation and subsequent amendments, primarily to omit 'Council' and substitute with 'Forum on Food Regulation'.
