Judges Review Conference 2007: Past, Present and Future Perspectives on the Law

Since its first appearance on 5 May 1927, the *Australian Law Journal* has been the dominant tall gum tree in the Australian legal landscape. In its first Foreword, in Volume I, Number 1, J G Latham said that the purpose of this new journal was, "to be a medium for the distribution of information and the interchange of ideas among legal practitioners in every State of the Commonwealth".
