DIFFICULTY IN OBTAINING A FAIR TRIAL IN TERRORISM CASES

The broad range of new anti-terrorist legislation, with its significant penalties, places special demands on the trial judge. It raises special challenges to the need to ensure that a fair trial is maintained, every person having a fundamental right to a fair trial. This article is concerned with the impact of new terrorism-related laws on the duties and responsibilities of judges in criminal trials.
